Objectives:

- To create awareness among students about the critical issue of child sexual abuse.
- To inculcate knowledge about the psychological, legal, and social aspects of sexual abuse, and emphasize the importance of prevention and timely intervention.

Program outcome: The NSS unit of Dadasaheb Balpande College of Pharmacy organized a guest lecture on the crucial and sensitive topic of Child Sexual Abuse on 26th September 2024. The session was held in the college premises and was delivered by Dr. Ramya Nisal, a respected expert in the field of child protection and mental health.

Dr. Nisal addressed the definition and scope of child sexual abuse, emphasizing that it is a grave violation of a child's rights and dignity. She clearly explained that a child cannot consent to any form of sexual activity, and any such act constitutes a punishable offense under the law. The lecture focused on the long-term psychological and emotional trauma faced by survivors and highlighted the urgent need for awareness, empathy, and intervention.

The session also included an overview of the POCSO Act (Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act), the legal rights of children, signs and symptoms of abuse, and the responsibilities of individuals, especially students and professionals, in preventing such crimes.

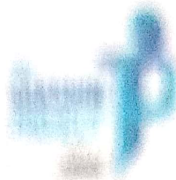
Key Points Covered


