'Electronic waste' or 'e-waste' may be defined as discarded computers, office electronic equipment, entertainment device, electronics, mobile phones, television sets, and refrigerators. This includes used electronics which are destined for reuse, resale, salvage, recycling, or disposal.

E-waste consists of all waste from electronic and electrical appliances which have reached their end- of- life period or are no longer fit for their original intended use and are destined for recovery, recycling or disposal. It includes computer and its accessories monitors, printers, keyboards, central processing units, remotes, compact discs, batteries, LCD / Plasma, air conditioners, refrigerators, sophisticated analytical equipments.

Following mechanism is adopted at DBCOP on E-waste Management

1. Purchase of certified and star rated electronic equipments.
2. Regular annual maintenance of electronic equipments.
3. Regular upgradation of electronic equipments.
4. Identification of obsolete equipments.
5. Disposal of obsolete equipments through scrap dealer.
